

KERMIT ROOSEVELT TO HUNT.

**Joins Party Going After Big Game
Near Gulf of California.**

LOS ANGELES, Cal., Aug. 8.—Kermit Roosevelt, second son of ex-President Roosevelt, is to go after big game in the wild regions, near the Gulf of California. In letters to-day to friends here young Roosevelt, who has been spending some time in Silver City, New Mexico, stated he would leave Yuma Aug. 9, for a ten-day hunt, returning to this city after he had bagged a few mountain sheep.

As most of the trip will be on horseback, Kermit will take to Yuma with him his own saddle, which he has used in Arizona and New Mexico. He will also be equipped with two high power guns, one of which was used by his father on the latter's trip after African lions. Ciriano Dominguez, an experienced guide of Yuma, will conduct Kermit to the Gulf's mouth.

The party will include A. L. Verdugo, Dr. R. R. Knotts, C. H. Utting, R. L. King, and Albert Andrade, all of Arizona.
