

GUARD FOR YOUNG ROOSEVELT

Rumors of Mexican Revolt Lead
Friends to Look for Him.

LOS ANGELES, Cal., Aug. 18.—E. P. Durning, a ranchman, of El Centro, who is stopping at the Hayward Hotel, says the recent reports of Americans being shot in Mexico have caused the people of the Imperial valley to send out a searching party for Kermit Roosevelt, who is in Lower California on a hunting trip, accompanied by Cipriano Dominguez, a Mexican scout.

“Young Roosevelt left Yuma on Aug. 11,” said Mr. Durning, “and the people down there decided to send out a party to act as his body guard. More than a hundred people signified their willingness to find Kermit and remain with him until his return to this side of the border, and ten were selected. They left El Centro yesterday.

“While it is not probable that any one would attack the young man knowing who he is, it was best not to take any chances, his friends thought. When he went into Lower California, trouble down there seemed to be at an end, but immediately after his departure reports of revolts were received.”
