## MRS. HILL GOING AWAY.

Will Never Return to This Cruel Land,  
Says Woman Caught Smuggling.

Mrs. Roberta Corwin-Hill, the daughter of Morris C. Menges, a horseman and real estate operator of Sheepshead Bay, is leaving this country to-day on the White Star liner Olympic, and, according to her friends, will never return to her native land. She has sold her automobile and the furniture of her apartment at 70 East Sixty-sixth Street. She seemed to have plenty of money when she bade adieu to her friends yesterday.

"I may see you in Paris," Mrs. Hill said. "but never again in this land that has behaved so cruelly to me."

Mrs. Hill referred to her imprisonment for three days in the Tombs last February after her conviction for smuggling a \$6,000 sable coat into this country.

At the age of 16, Roberta Menges was known as the belle of Sheepshead Bay, and was married to Halsey Corwin, who had \$800,000 and was earning the reputation of being the biggest spender in Brooklyn. Afterward she obtained a divorce and married Capt. James Hill of the British Army, whom she also divorced.
